#### **Meet the Ambassadors**

#### **Johnstown**

Riley is a thriving kindergartener who loves horseback riding. She was born deaf due to auditory neuropathy, a rare genetic chromosomal disorder. At 18 months she received cochlear implants, an implanted device that helps Riley perceive sounds.



Riley began speech therapy at Easterseals when she was two years old and had trouble saying single words.



Right away, Riley's family saw a huge difference in her speech. Four years later, Riley is six years old and has made leaps and bounds in her speech and communication.

#### **Pittsburgh**



Aubrey is a fun-loving kiddo who likes toys that light up and the accessible swing. When Aubrey was 18 months old, she was diagnosed with Kabuki Syndrome, a rare genetic condition that affects 1 out of 32,000 births worldwide. Symptoms from Kabuki Syndrome include global development delay, low muscle tone, feeding difficulties which require her to be fully fed via a gastronomy tube, astigmatism, and seizures during infancy.

Aubrey is nonverbal and was recently diagnosed with autism.

Aubrey began attending Easterseals' Approved Private School for children with disabilities in August 2022. Three years later, Aubrey is six years old, and her development has progressed significantly. She is becoming more independent with everyday tasks and activities, and she's able to communicate her wants and needs. Aubrey's parents are grateful Easterseals can provide Aubrey with the support and resources she needs to succeed both now and as she grows into adulthood.
